Annual Report of the West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission For the year 2014-15 (upto 31st March, 2015) (u/s 105 of the Electricity Act, 2003 and Rules made thereunder)

 Introduction – The Govt. of West Bengal constituted The West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission (WBERC) under sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Electricity Regulatory Commissions Act, 1998 (14 of 1998), vide Notification No. 06-Power/III dated 6.1.1999. The Commission became formally functional with the joining of its first Chairperson on 31.3.1999. The Electricity Regulatory Commissions Act, 1998 was repealed by the Electricity Act, 2003 (36 of 2003). The Electricity Act, 2003 came into force w.e.f. 10.06.03. The WBERC established under section 17(1) of the Electricity Regulatory Commissions Act, 1998 became the State Commission for the purposes of The Electricity Act, 2003 in terms of first proviso to sub-section (1) of section 82 of the said Act.

The State Commission continued as a body corporate by the name aforesaid (WBERC), having perpetual succession and a common seal, with power to acquire, hold and dispose of property, both movable and immovable, and to contract and shall, by the said name, sue or be sued.

2. Organization Chart :-

With the coming into force of the Electricity Act, 2003, the responsibilities of the Commission increased manifold and so did the requirement of manpower. The Department of Power, Government of West Bengal in consultation with the Finance Department, Government of West Bengal accorded approval specifying number, nature and categories of the officers and employees and their salaries, allowances etc., and accordingly a fresh regulation called the West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission (Number, Nature and Categories of Other Employees and Salaries, Allowances and Other Conditions of Service of Secretary, Other Officers and Employees) Regulations, 2006 was duly published in the Kolkata Gazette on 04.05.2006 under Notification No. 29/WBERC dated 04.05.2006 on repealing the previous Regulations. Schedule showing the number, nature, and categories of posts in the Commission as specified in the said Regulations is at Annexure I.

Functions of the Commission:-

Previously i.e. prior to 10.6.2003, the Commission was to discharge only those functions that had been given to it by the State Government under the Electricity Regulatory Commissions Act, 1998 (No. 14 of 1998).

After repeal of the Electricity Regulatory Commissions Act, 1998 and its replacement by the Electricity Act, 2003 with effect from 10.6.2003, the functions of the Commission were widened. Section 86 of the Electricity Act, 2003 outlines the functions of the Commission which are reproduced below:-

"86(1) The State Commission shall discharge the following functions, namely:----

(1) (a) determine the tariff for generation, supply, transmission and wheeling of electricity, wholesale, bulk or retail, as the case may be, within the State:

Provided that where open access has been permitted to a category of consumers under section 42, the State Commission shall determine only the wheeling charges and surcharge thereon, if any, for the said category of consumers;

- (b) regulate electricity purchase and procurement process of distribution licensees including the price at which electricity shall be procured from the generating companies or licensees or from other sources through agreements for purchase of power for distribution and supply within the State;
- (c) facilitate intra-State transmission and wheeling of electricity;
- (d) issue licenses to persons seeking to act as transmission licensees, distribution licensees and electricity traders with respect to their operations within the State;
- (e) promote cogeneration and generation of electricity from renewable sources of energy by providing suitable measures for connectivity with the grid and sale of electricity to any person, and also specify, for purchase of electricity from such sources, a percentage of the total consumption of electricity in the area of a distribution licensee;
- (f) adjudicate upon the disputes between the licensees and generating companies and to refer any dispute for arbitration;
- (g) levy fee for the purpose of this Act;
- (h) specify State Grid Code consistent with the Grid Code specified under clause (h) of sub-section (1) of section 79;



- (i) specify or enforce standards with respect to quality, continuity and reliability of service by licensees;
- (j) fix the trading margin in the intra-State trading of electricity, if considered, necessary;
- (k) discharge such other functions as may be assigned to it under this Act;
- (2) The State Commission shall advise the State Government on all or any of the following matters, namely:—
 - promotion of competition, efficiency and economy in activities of the electricity industry;
 - (ii) promotion of investment in electricity industry;
 - (iii) reorganization and restructuring of electricity industry in the State;
 - (iv) matters concerning generation, transmission, distribution and trading of electricity or any other matter referred to the State Commission by that Government;
- (3) The State Commission shall ensure transparency while exercising its powers and discharging its functions.
- (4) In discharge of its functions, the State Commission shall be guided by the National Electricity Policy, National Electricity Plan and Tariff Policy published under section 3."

These apart, the State Commissions are, inter alia, to help development of market, regulate supply, distribution, consumption and use of electricity, as also to protect the interest of the consumers.

4. State Advisory Committee – Organisation and functions:—

Section 87 of the Electricity Act, 2003 empowers the State Commission to establish a State Advisory Committee with effect from such date as it may specify in a notification. Accordingly, the WBERC issued a notification no. 9/WBERC dated 08.08.2003, published in the Kolkata Gazette on 05.09.2003 constituting the State Advisory Committee w.e.f. 01.12.2003. Section 88 of the Electricity Act, 2003 provides Objects of the State Advisory Committee. This section provides that the objects of the State Advisory Committee shall be, to advise the State Commission on major questions of policy matters, matters relating to quality, continuity and extent of service provided by the licensees, compliance by licensees with the conditions and requirements of their licence, protection of consumer interest and electricity supply and overall standards of performance by utilities. In supersession of Order No. 92 issued under Notification



No. WBERC/A-22/1/967 dated 17.03.2004, in the matter of composition of the West Bengal State Advisory Committee, the Commission vide Order No. 179 issued under Notification No. WBERC/A-22/2/1155 dated 05.11.2007 laid down composition of the Committee afresh comprising the members including ex-officio Chairperson and ex-officio Members, to represent the interest of Commerce, Industry, Transport, Agriculture, Labour, Consumers, Non-Governmental Organisations and Academic and Research bodies in the Electricity Sector as required under sub-sections (2) & (3) of section 87 of the Electricity Act, 2003.

This Commission takes the advice of Members on policy matters like framing of Regulations etc.

5. Progress of different works of the Commission:-

(a) HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR 2014-2015

- In order to reduce overall system Transmission and Distribution (T&D) Loss as well as to flatten the load curve, the Commission is continuing special emphasis in its Tariff orders issued during the year 2014-15 on voltage wise graded Load factor rebate and load factor surcharge.
- Rebate for industrial consumer having contract demand 1.5 MVA or above has been continuing at the rate specified in the Tariff Order for 2014-15 for load factor range between 65% up to 80% and above 80% respectively during the year 2014-15 (for WBSEDCL consumers).
- In order to curb commercial loss, pre-paid tariff scheme has been continued by setting the tariff at uniform rate and for easy availability of vendors of the pre-paid meters.
- The Commission is also continuing its special importance in its Tariff Orders issued for the year 2014-15 to Demand Side Management (DSM) with some rebate as was applicable for the year 2013-14 in each slab of power factor range on high power factor(>92%) to reduce effect of reactive power drawal in the system.
- In order to encourage one time payment for three months bill, a special rebate of 10 paise per unit is also continuing for the year 2014-15 (for WBSEDCL consumers) to contain the commercial loss in the system.
- In addition to the other applicable rebates, an additional rebate of 1% of the billed amount is being continued by the Commission to the consumers who pays their energy bills through e-payment facility (through web by using net banking, debit card, credit card, electronic clearing scheme).



- The Commission is also continuing with its special tariff for the metered street lighting with LED.
- Special rebate on energy charge for Cold storage or dairy with chilling plant having contractual load between 50 KVA and 125 KVA is also continuing for the year 2014-15.
- To encourage Time of Day (TOD) tariff mechanism in the DSM perspective, the Commission, in its Tariff Orders issued for the year 2014-15, has continued normal TOD category of consumers and Pre-paid TOD category of consumers under TOD tariff scheme.

(b) Budget

The Revised Budget Estimate for the year 2014 - 2015 and the Budget Estimate for the year 2015 - 2016 were sent to the Department of Power vide this office letter No. WBERC/ D-1/Pt-V/0819 dated 24.11.2014. (Copy enclosed as Annexure-II).

(c) Regulations

WBERC makes Regulations with previous publication of draft Regulations inviting objections and suggestions from all stakeholders and interested persons. Notice inviting objections and suggestions on the draft Regulations is published in some leading dailies – English, Bengali and Hindi. Draft of Regulations are also uploaded in the website of the Commission inviting objections/suggestions/comments from all stakeholders and interested persons. Drafts of the proposed Regulations are also sent to the State Government in the Department of Power & Non-conventional Energy Sources, all distribution licensees and generating companies under the purview of the Commission in the state, all members of the Advisory Committee, Central Electricity Regulatory Commission and State Electricity Regulatory Commissions inviting objections/suggestions/comments received if any, finally approves the Regulations for publication in Kolkata Gazette. The Regulations after publication in Kolkata Gazette (Extraordinary) are sent for laying before the West Bengal Legislative Assembly as required under section 182 of the Electricity Act, 2003.

- (d) The Commission is presently working in the hired accommodation at FD 415A, Poura Bhavan, 3rd Floor, Sector - III, Bidhannagar, Kolkata - 700 106 with effect from April 2001. The office of Ombudsman has been working in a hired accommodation at "Bikalpa Shakti Bhavan", 3rd Floor, J-1/10, EP & GP Block, Sector-V, Salt Lake, Kolkata - 700 091.
- (e) The Commission renewed the memberships of the Forum of Indian Regulators and the Forum of Regulators for the year 2014-2015 vide WBERC/D-8/1/0177-0178 dated 19.5.2014. Chairperson of this Commission is a member of Forum of Regulators constituted in terms of section 166(2) of the Electricity Act, 2003.
- (f) The Commission has become a Member of South Asia Forum for Infrastructure Regulation (SAFIR) for the year 2011-12. SAFIR was formed in 1999 with the support of the World Bank as a network of infrastructure regulators of the region (comprising Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, India and Pakistan), connected international institutions and individuals that are active in the field. The Commission renewed membership of the SAFIR vide WBERC/B-68/SAFIR/2/0176 dated 19.05.2014 for the year 2014-15.
- (g) The Commission has become a member of Forum of Regulators For Eastern And North-Eastern States (FORENS) in 2013. The Commission has contributed membership fees for the year 2014-15 vide WBERC/A-14/7/1/0692 dated 13.10.2014.

(i) Consumer Complaints

i) Regulations

In order to protect the interest of the consumers, the Commission took appropriate action as per provisions of Electricity Act, 2003. At present the West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission (Guidelines for Establishment of Forum for Redressal of Grievances of Consumers and Time and Manner of Dealing with such Grievances by the Ombudsman) Regulations, 2013 issued under notification No.56/WBERC dated 26.08.2013 and published in Kolkata Gazette (Extraordinary Part-I) dated 26.08.2013 is in force. This has replaced the previous Regulations made in 2006.

ii) Ombudsman & Redressal of Grievances of Consumers:

In terms of the provisions of the Regulations mentioned above, there shall be as many Grievance Redressal Officers (GRO) as may be necessary at the rate of at least one such officer at each sub-district/district/region/zone/headquarter level in each of distribution licensees. As per provisions of the above named Regulations, a forum is set up by each distribution licensee to redress the grievances of its consumers. The forum consists of Grievance Redressal Officers at different levels of the organization of each distribution licensee. Any consumer can take his grievance(s) to such Grievance Redressal Officers for its/their redressal by submitting a grievance petition in writing in accordance with the provisions of the above mentioned Regulations. The names, official designations, address etc. of the Grievance Redressal Officers of a distribution licensee should be available in the offices / sub-



offices, bill payment centers, websites etc. of the distribution licensee. However, no fee is required to be paid by a consumer for submission of a grievance petition to a Grievance Redressal Officer. On receipt of a grievance petition, the concerned Grievance Redressal Officer is to acknowledge receipt of such a petition by a written communication within 7 (seven) working days from the date of its receipt. If the grievance does not call for any consultation with a technical expert or a spot visit, the Grievance Redressal Officer is required to dispose of the grievance petition after giving a reasonable opportunity of hearing to the aggrieved consumer and others within a period of 40 (forty) working days from the date of sending the acknowledgement. If on the other hand the redressal of the grievance requires a consultation with a technical expert and / or a spot inspection, the Grievance Redressal Officer is required to dispose of the grievance petition after hearing all concerned within 60 (sixty) days from the date of sending the acknowledgement. The Grievance Redressal Officer is required to give a certified copy of his order by which he has disposed of the grievance petition to the grievance petitioner and also to the licensee within 7 (seven) working days from the date of passing of the order. If a consumer still feels aggrieved, he may move the Ombudsman representing his case through a written submission in the format specified for this purpose. The necessary condition for doing the same is that the aggrieved consumer had already approached at least one Grievance Redressal Officer seeking redressal of his grievance. If the licensee does not comply with the orders of GRO/CGRO within 100 (one hundred) working days from the date of lodging of his grievances, or if a consumer is not satisfied with the order from the GRO or the CGRO, as aforesaid, or if he does not receive any order from the GRO or the CGRO to whom he has approached at the first instance seeking redressal of his grievance(s), he may submit a written representation to the Ombudsman for the purpose of settlement of his grievances/complaints. No fee is needed to be paid for approaching the Ombudsman.

Office of the Ombudsman, West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission for all distribution licensees in the State as required under section 42(6) of the Electricity Act, 2003 started functioning from 21.06.2004 within the office of the Commission itself and presently the Office of the Ombudsman is functioning in the hired accommodation at "Bikalpa Shakti Bhavan (WBREDA)", 3rd Floor, J-1/10, EP & GP Block, Sector-V, Salt Lake, Kolkata - 700 091 at the usual office hours on all the working days in a week.

During 2014-15 Office of Ombudsman received 744 cases plus pending 1608 cases (Total - 2352), out of which 1761 cases disposed.

iii) Consumer complaints received by the Commission:

Complaints against the licensees were lodged by the consumers to the Commission alleging wrong security deposit, excess billing, incorrect disconnection, non-receipt of meter, non-compliance of provisions of the Electricity Act, 2003 and Regulations framed thereunder. Some of those complaints were taken up with the utilities for obtaining reports. On receipt of reports, the Commission took view on the allegations. The Commission so far received **1098** complaints. **51** cases were redirected to the Ombudsman. So Commission had dealt with **1047** cases and disposed of all complaints. Since forum for redressal of consumer grievances and the Ombudsman are now fully operational, Commission was not required to take up any hearing of the complaints lodged to the Commission during 2014-15. Those matters were disposed of on obtaining reports from licensees and advising the applicants suitably. Only the issues referred to the Commission under section 142 of the Electricity Act, 2003 were dealt by the Commission as per procedure.
